Words of Torah from Rabbi Isaacs

"Do not hide your face from me." This line from Psalm 27 is one of the phrases from the psalm for the days of repentance that has always resonated with me the most. We know that no one literally has ever seen God's face, even Moses, despite his deep desire to know the Force who gave him the law. So why do we ask God not to hide Their face from us? Obviously, we know the request is not literal. We beg God not to withdraw the Divine Presence from our lives. We ask God not to "ghost" us, not to turn away from difficult conversations, or even from offering rebuke, but rather to be present. God cannot always be loving or accepting, but we pray that God continue to be present.

The great tension that animates Sukkot is that the festival is a time of simultaneous joy and vulnerability. The open places in the roofs of our sukkot are there to provide spaces for God to protect us and to feel the Divine presence. Vulnerability and joy can only be linked when you are secure and confident that someone is there to stand with you in your vulnerability and loneliness. Sukkot is not only a reminder of God's presence in the world, but a reminder to show up for one another time and time again. Our world is better when we have the opportunity to be vulnerable, but that vulnerability can only be revealed in the context of community and security. Let us show up for one another this Sukkot, and provide each other with the presence and security we need to survive and thrive. It is then, even when life is chaotic and cruel, that we can truly find joy in this world, both during Sukkot, and at every season.

Torah on Tap Series: Great Sermons in Jewish History: Wednesdays, Oct 3, 17, and Nov 7, 6pm at Mainely Brews.




